General Requirements for the Bachelor of Liberal Studies Degree

- Students must be 24 years of age when they start the BLS degree.
- New students should take the Roosevelt University Assessment test before registering for their first semester. Students will not be allowed to register for a second semester at Roosevelt until the RUA is completed. The RUA will determine placement into appropriate English and Math courses.
- Students must successfully complete 30 semester hours of credit at Roosevelt University (residency requirement).
- Students must have a 2.0 grade point average to graduate.
- Students must complete a minimum of 21 semester hours of coursework at the 300-level at Roosevelt.
- The PLS Senior Seminars are only open to students who have completed PLS 201 or PLS 302 and the University Writing Requirement.
- PLS 399, Senior Thesis, is open to students who have completed PLS 201 or PLS 302, the University Writing Requirement, two Senior Seminars, and who are within 21 hours of graduation.

Specific Requirements and Notes for the Bachelor of Liberal Studies in History

- Specialty Area: Courses should be related in theme or subject matter (e.g., social justice, gerontology, or African-American studies). Students may earn a Minor in a discipline by fulfilling requirements specified in the Roosevelt catalog.
- Graduate study in History: Students intending graduate study in the history of a foreign culture are strongly advised to take two years of a foreign language.
- Teaching in History: Students interested in teaching history in the secondary schools should arrange their programs of study far in advance in consultation with both the College of Education and History faculty.
- History 111 and History 112: Western Civilization courses in transfer may be used as a substitute.
- Term Papers: Students must fulfill this requirement by submitting three passing term papers from three separate history courses to the chairperson of the History department, or by completing a Senior Thesis approved by a PLS faculty member and a History Department faculty member.
