Note for Accounting Students: 150 semester hours of credit, undergraduate, graduate, or combination, is required to sit for the CPA (Certified Public Accountant) exam. Bachelor of Professional Studies graduates can fulfill this 150-semester-hour requirement by earning additional graduate credit either through degree programs such as the MBA or MSA or through additional coursework in areas such as professional accounting, taxation, and management advisory services and related fields. The CMA (Certified Management Accountant) requires a baccalaureate degree to sit for the exam.
