## **Anne Mansfield Scholarship Application**

Each semester, the Mansfield Institute for Social Justice at Roosevelt University will award a tuition scholarship in honor of Anne Mansfield. The Mansfield scholar will work with Institute faculty on social justice-relevant research. The Mansfield Institute for Social Justice was created in 1999 through a generous gift from the Mansfield Foundation. The Institute offers classes on social justice topics, grants an undergraduate minor in social justice, sponsors research on the causes and consequences of social injustice, and develops programs to bring information about social justice to the community at large.

The Mansfield scholar should expect to contribute approximately one to five hours of work per week to the Institute during the semester for which the scholarship is granted. These hours include but are not limited to: assisting in planning and coordinating social justice-related events. In return, the scholar will receive tuition credit for one social justice-related course.

The scholarship applicant must have met the admission requirements for a degree-seeking program at Roosevelt University. In selecting Mansfield scholars, Mansfield faculty will review the applicant's academic and Roosevelt University transcripts. Potential scholars are also required to submit an essay (see the reverse side of this form) and have an interview conducted.

Educational inequalities (i.e. school systems, quality of learning, etc.)

Global justice (i.e. genocide, human rights of women, colonization, etc.)

Policing, incarceration, sentencing and prison reform (i.e. higher education for inmates, medical care, etc.)

HIV/AIDS

Questions to consider:

What is social justice/injustice?

How did you become interested in social justice?

How do/will you use the tenets of social justice in everyday experiences?

How would you approach social injustice in your area of interest? Think about resources, people, groups and the steps involved in the process.
