

- Essay Question #1:** Of the books you have read or the films or plays you have seen over the past two years, which one was your favorite? Why?
- Essay Question #2:** Describe one major co-curricular or community activity in which you have been involved. Discuss how you have exhibited leadership through this activity and describe what qualities you believe are most important in your leadership role.
- Essay Question #3:** What do you see as the most pressing issue facing your community? What community service project would you wish to create to address this issue and how would you implement this project?
- Essay Question #4:** What experience, class, teacher, or subject sparked your interest in the sciences? How has that interest influenced your view of your future path and your place in the world?

Applications for the Scholars Program are encouraged for the fall and spring semesters. Priority consideration will be given when applications are received before April 1st for the fall semester and December 1st for spring semester.

The Scholars program encourages high school applicants, as well as transfer and current Roosevelt students with strong academic records, recommendations from teachers/faculty, and community and/or school involvement.

After your Scholars application and academic record have been approved by the director, you may be invited to participate in an interview with the director or faculty and staff members.
