Two separate courses in Spring 2014:

Development as a Cultural Process PSYC 383 / 483

An undergraduate/graduate course exploring human development as a cultural process situated in the communities, places and historical eras in which it occurs. Students will compare and contrast the sociocultural contexts of development across communities.

Multicultural Psychology

PSYC 644 / CHS 425

A graduate course surveying the social, historical, cultural and psychological contexts people inhabit. We will explore how these may influence intercultural communication and interaction, particularly in therapeutic and educational settings.

Both courses run throughout the semester and end with a trip to Guatemala May 2nd – May 11th.
