



The Path to Enlightenment Challenge

The Center for Campus Life proudly introduces **The Path to Enlightenment Challenge**, an exciting addition to Roosevelt University's Enlightenment Project. The Challenge will support and recognize students, faculty and staff who go out into their communities and volunteer their time for a cause of their choice or at one of our monthly non-profit organization. The Path to Enlightenment Challenge will aid in accomplishing the campus goal of 2,000 volunteer hours and 2,000 donations for the academic year. The Center for Campus Life will offer resources and contact information to local non-profit organizations near the Roosevelt University Campus and surrounding communities along with additional guidance towards addressing student and faculty interests.

The challenge will include three levels of recognition. All participating volunteers will start as an **Apprentice** where they will complete and record 10 volunteer hours for the semester. Once they surpass the first challenge, these volunteers will continue to advance to the next level and become an **Agent of Change**. The Agent of Change level challenges volunteers to complete and record 20 volunteer hours for the semester. Should they accomplish this challenge they will continue to advance towards their final stage of Enlightenment, as **The Enlightened One**. The final stage of Enlightenment will challenge volunteers to complete and record 30 or more volunteer hours for the semester.

As each level is achieved, volunteers will be recognized for their dedication to the non-profit organization at which they are volunteering. Volunteers that achieve all three levels of Enlightenment will then be inducted into the Excellence in **Community Leadership Society** at the Student Leadership Dinner on April 8, 2011 with an Enlightenment pin to wear at their Commencement Ceremony. Faculty and staff who take part in the challenge will also be recognized for their efforts and dedication in accomplishing our campus goal.
