General Requirements for the Bachelor of Liberal Studies Degree

- Students must be 24 years of age when they start the BLS degree.
- New students should take the Roosevelt University Assessment test before registering for their first semester. Students will not be allowed to register for a second semester at Roosevelt until the RUA is completed. The RUA will determine placement into appropriate English and Math courses.
- The final 30 semester hours of any Roosevelt University degree must be completed at Roosevelt University.
- Students must have a 2.0 grade point average to graduate.
- Students must complete a minimum of 21 semester hours of coursework at the 300-level at Roosevelt.
- PLS 290: Students transferring in MATH 110 “Quantitative Literacy,” or substantial math including College Algebra or College Statistics with a C or better but no Quantitative Literacy course may be waived out of PLS 290.
- The PLS Senior Seminars are only open to students who have completed PLS 201 or PLS 302 and the University Writing Requirement.
- PLS 399, Senior Thesis, is open to students who have completed PLS 201 or PLS 302, the University Writing Requirement, two Senior Seminars, and who are within 21 hours of graduation.

Specific Requirements and Notes for the Bachelor of Liberal Studies with an Individualized Program

The Individualized Program must conform to these rules:

- The Individualized Program will be made up of a minimum of 48 semester hours with at least 36 semester hours at the 200 level and above and at least 15 semester hours at the 300 level. Nine of the fifteen semester hours at the 300 level must be taken at Roosevelt. No more than six semester hours of D grades are allowed in the major.
- Courses in the Individualized Program will be taken from at least two but no more than four academic departments. The following subjects can be treated as one academic department: 1) Sociology & Anthropology and 2) Management, Human Resources, & Information Systems.
- The Individualized Program will be designed in a conference between the student and the academic advisor. The program must be approved by the Assistant Dean before it is considered an acceptable curriculum for a Bachelor of Liberal Studies degree.
- In the Individualized Program, up to five courses that transfer as $2\frac{2}{3}$ semester hours may count as a one-to-one course equivalency. All courses that transfer as $2\frac{2}{3}$ semester hours may be used as long as the total number of hours in the major adds up to at least 46 semester hours.
