General Requirements for the Bachelor of Professional Studies Degree

- Students must be at least 24 years of age when they start the BPS degree.
- New students should take the Roosevelt University Assessment test before registering for their first semester. Students will not be allowed to register for a second semester at Roosevelt until the RUA is completed. The RUA will determine placement into appropriate English and Math courses.
- The final 30 semester hours of any Roosevelt University degree must be completed at Roosevelt University.
- Students must have a 2.0 grade point average to graduate.
- Students must complete a minimum of 21 semester hours of coursework at the 300-level at Roosevelt.
- PLS 290: Students transferring in MATH 110 "Quantitative Literacy," or substantial math including College Algebra or College Statistics with a C or better but no Quantitative Literacy course may be waived out of PLS 290.
- The PLS Senior Seminars are only open to students who have completed PLS 201 or PLS 302 and the University Writing Requirement.
- PLS 399, Senior Thesis, is open to students who have completed PLS 201 or PLS 302, the University Writing Requirement, two Senior Seminars, and who are within 21 hours of graduation.

Additional Notes concerning the Bachelor of Professional Studies Degree with a Major in Sustainability Studies

- SUST 210, Sustainable Future, is a recommended first course in the major.
- English 101 is a pre-requisite for all 200-level Sustainability Studies courses.
- The University Writing Requirement is a pre-requisite for all 300-level Sustainability Studies courses.
- Grade of C- or higher required in all Sustainability Studies courses
- <u>Relevant Elective</u>: Two courses (six semester hours) chosen in consultation with an advisor from the
 following subject areas: additional Sustainability Studies, Commerce and Enterprise, Criminal Justice,
 Hospitality and Tourism Mgmt., Organizational Leadership, Paralegal Studies, Biology, Chemistry,
 Environmental Science, GIS, Math (especially statistics).
- <u>Double-Majors</u>: The Relevant Elective courses may be combined with the Concentration courses to form a Double-Major in the following areas: Commerce and Enterprise, Criminal Justice, Hospitality and Tourism Management, Organizational Leadership, and Paralegal Studies. All Major requirements in those disciplines must be met. See an advisor.
- Minors: Courses in the Functional Area and Relevant Elective may qualify for an academic Minor in a
 discipline if all requirements are fulfilled per the RU undergrad catalog.
