## LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS AND INITIATIVES

1. **American Association of Colleges of Pharmacy-Academic Leadership Fellow Program (ALFP)**. There are only 30 fellows that are selected from a national pool of applicants from 130 various colleges and schools of pharmacy to participate in this program. The fellows are selected based on their competencies, past leadership experiences, talents for serving as future leaders, and recommendations from their local CEO Dean. The ALFP program started on July 2013 and will end on July of 2014. In addition to participating in four live sessions and completing leadership activities, the fellows are required to complete a research project. The fellows collaborate with their local Dean mentor on several leadership projects at their institution. In addition, the fellows are assigned to a national facilitator who will serve as a Dean or Provost mentor. This mentor plays a critical role in supporting and empowering the fellows by enhancing their leadership development throughout the entire program.

2. **ALFP Leadership Project at Roosevelt University.** The local Dean mentor identified several strategic planning projects during my ALFP. At the university level, I was selected to represent the College of Pharmacy on the “Roosevelt University Goal One Executive Committee.” The committee was charged with developing a strategic plan, which includes a university vision and mission, leadership structure, governance model, cross-college collaboration strategies, financial support, and marketing plan. During the past year, the committee met with the president, provost, CFO, and the Deans to collect data before developing the strategic plan. In addition, the committee held several open forums and met with several stakeholders to gather critical information. In May of 2014, the committee submitted the strategic plan to the president, provost, deans, and board of trustees for implementation during the next five years.
3. **ALFP Leadership Project at Roosevelt College of Pharmacy-Strategic Plan.** The local Dean mentor identified several strategic planning project as one of the leadership activities at the college level. I conducted a survey among the faculty to identify strategic goals and objectives for the next five years. I analyzed the results of the survey and identified five strategic goals. A workgroup of (3-5 faculty) and a group lead were assigned to each goal. Each workgroup were charged with identifying objectives, strategies, outcomes, responsible person, and a timeline for achieving the goal. I took the lead on one of the strategic goals and supervised the other four workgroups. I held one-on-one meetings with the group leads and invited faculty to a town hall meeting to get feedback. In April of 2014, the final strategic goals, objectives, and outcomes were voted on by the faculty and shared with the ACPE On-Site Visit team.
4. **ALFP Leadership Project at Roosevelt College of Pharmacy-Mission and Vision.** The local Dean mentor identified revising the Mission and Vision as a second project at the college level. I was selected to serve as a Co-Chair of a Professional Council Committee with the dean for revising the RUCOP Mission and Vision. We developed a new Mission, Vision, and a list of Core Values for the college in collaboration with members of the Professional Council. We shared the document with the students, faculty, staff for their feedback. We presented the final document at the Faculty Council and Professional Council Meetings for a final vote.
5. **ACPE On-Site Evaluator Team Member.** Since 2003, I served on the ACPE Steering Committees for several ACPE accreditation visits. In 2007, I completed the ACPE On-Site Visit Training at the American Association of Colleges of Pharmacy Annual Meeting. Since 2007 till 2014, I have been invited to participate in several national ACPE accreditation visits. In 2014, I completed the ACPE Global On-Site Visit webinar and live training. In April of 2014, I participated in an International ACPE On-Site Visit.

6. **ACPE Consultant and an Associate Dean for Experiential Education at Roosevelt University College of Pharmacy.** In the summer 2010, I was invited by the CEO Dean to serve as a consultant for the leadership team in preparation for the ACPE visit. I visited Roosevelt College of Pharmacy before the accreditation visit. I provided syllabi, manuals, assessment instruments, and training to the Assistant Dean of Experiential Education. I also met with the Department Chair and provided Syllabi for the Public Health and Pharmacy Administration didactic courses. In the Fall of 2010, I participated in the ACPE On-Site Visit as the Associate Dean for Experiential Education.
